

# **1 PRO POLISH / APPLICATION DIRECTIONS**

1. Polish can be applied in the direct sun or on a warm surface in the shade.

## **2. Wash and dry surface.**

3. Fill (2) moderate sized buckets with water. One bucket for application and second for clean wipe. Put fresh microfiber cloths in both buckets.

## **4. Use microfiber cloth to apply polish. When ready, pull a cloth from the water and ring it out completely.**

5. Fold cloth in 1/2, then into 1/4.

## **6. Apply a quarter size swirl of polish onto cloth.**

7. Start with one panel or section at a time. Typically, I like to start with the roof or top and work my way down. If applying for the first time, start somewhere small like a trunk lid. ## **8. *\*\*Never pour polish directly onto the surface\*\****

9. Move the cloth over the surface in a north / south motion and then in an east / west motion. Use a bit of pressure from the side of the hand versus using fingertip pressure. Flip the cloth and apply a bit more polish and repeat. Repeat this step until the surface feels smooth under the cloth and hand. Older surfaces (typically with single stage paint) may require additional applications. So, keep the cloths fresh; this way you can better monitor the oxidation or contamination removal.

## **10. *\*\*Polish is only designed to remove the dead top surface without removing the good surface below.\*\****

11. When satisfied with the feel and look of the surface, take a clean cloth from the clean wipe bucket and ring it about halfway. Wipe the surface down and then use a clean dry microfiber cloth and buff surface dry. Have a few dry microfiber cloths available as they will get damp.
